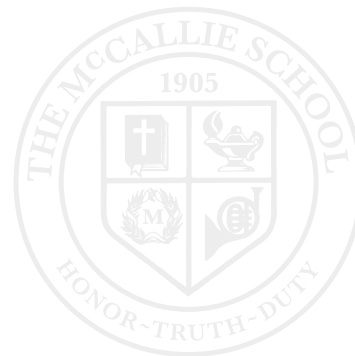

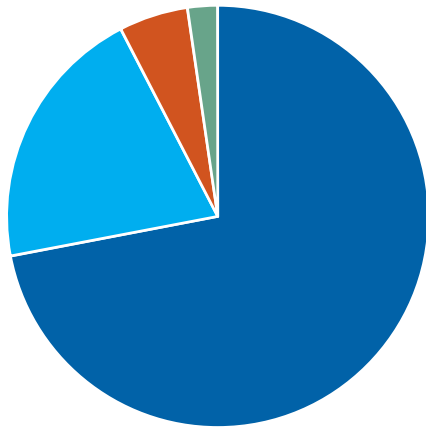

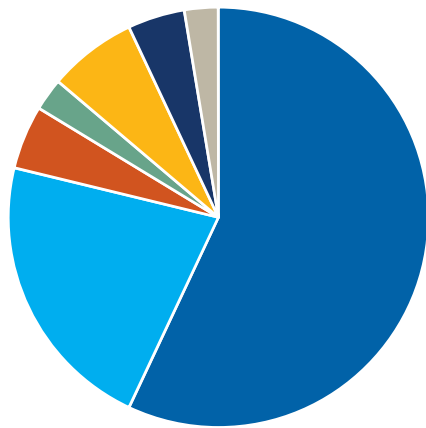

OPERATING BUDGET

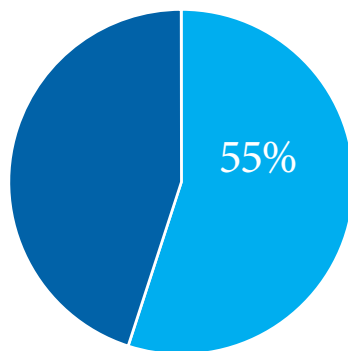
McCallie’s budget is the financial translation of the school’s day-to-day priorities and activities that accomplish the mission of the school.

Our three main revenue streams – enrollment, endowment, and Honor Fund – are strong because of the trust that our community and alumni place in us. This is good because our three main expenses – salaries, benefits, and physical plant upkeep – are incredibly important. These three main expenses reflect McCallie’s commitment to its faculty who invest their lives in our students and the spaces in which they do their transformative work with boys.

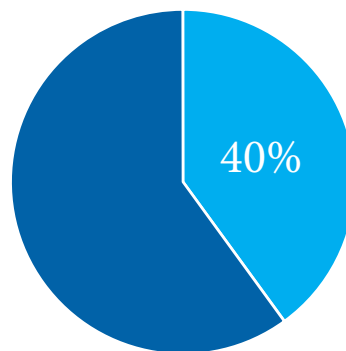
Another significant priority in the school’s operating budget is financial aid; 55% of boarding students and 40% of day students receive financial aid.

FACILITIES

Just as the school's first capital gift, the contribution of 40 acres of land and Founders Home by the McCallie family, was vital to McCallie's start, giving for capital projects remains a top priority. Each of the school's buildings represent a previous generation of McCallie alumni paying forward the life-changing experiences they had at McCallie. As former Head of School Spencer McCallie '55 often said, "We drink from wells we did not dig."

The jointly-owned GPS-McCallie Rowing Center is our most recent capital project to be completed. As one of the premier boathouses in the South, it will help McCallie attract rowers from across the country. We are grateful for the donors who saw the vision for this partnership with GPS, contributed to this facility, and improved river access for the school's rowing program.

It is worth remembering that the school's facilities come with significant operational and renewal costs. Facilities expenditures are second only to faculty compensation in McCallie's budget. Our facilities team does an incredible job of keeping our campus beautiful and maintained with multiple buildings spread out over many acres. Yet, the independent boarding school environment is highly competitive and offering exceptional, modern, well-maintained facilities to support our program is essential.

What is PRRSM? Pronounced *prism*, PRRSM is an acronym that stands for Provision for Plant Replacement, Renewal, and Special Maintenance. The PRRSM budget is used for major capital expenditures such as roofs and HVAC systems, as well as for reimagining spaces that have outlived their use. One recent example of a PRRSM transformation is the Center for Animation, Video, and Entertainment (the CAVE), the lower level of the academic center.

ENDOWMENT

McCallie's Board of Trustees approved the establishment of the Founders' Fund in 1959 as its first endowment fund. Funded by 72 original donors, the proceeds were designated by the Board to be used annually to give mission-appropriate boys in need the ability to attend McCallie.

What is an endowment? Endowments are funds held in perpetuity and invested to provide long-term income. McCallie has two types of endowment: a permanent endowment established by donor giving and a board-designated endowment in which funds, such as unrestricted bequests, have been invested. These types of unrestricted

gifts allow the school to be flexible when unfavorable economic conditions strike and to be bold in the advancement of the school's strategic imperatives during periods of favorable economic conditions.

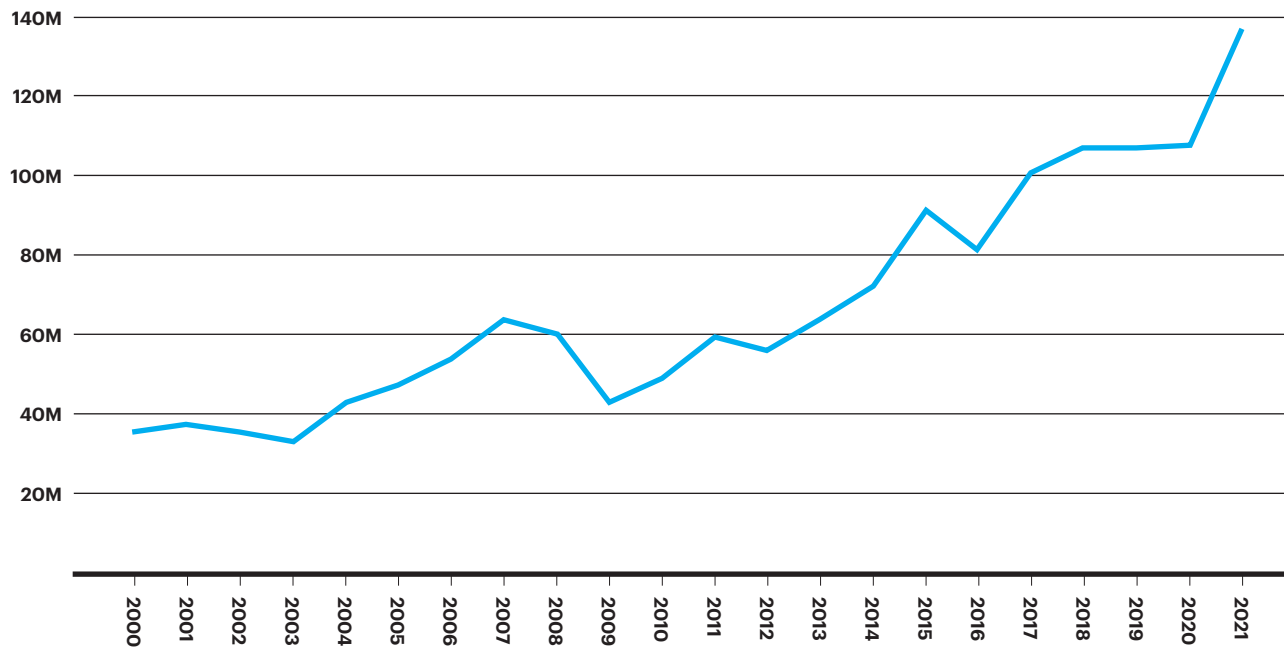
An endowment's corpus cannot be spent by the school. Instead, only a small percentage can be spent annually from the fund's earnings. While McCallie's net endowment is valued at \$138.7 million as of June 30, 2021, the draw from McCallie's endowment is substantially less: \$7.3 million.

In comparison with many of our peer institutions, McCallie was late to establish an endowment and as a

result we lag behind these schools in this important benchmark. Our strategic goal for the endowment is to grow to \$250 million. We are grateful for the donors who have committed legacy gifts to the future of McCallie's endowment so that we can be more competitive on a national level.

McCallie's endowment experienced tremendous growth in the 2020-21 fiscal year, fueled primarily by market growth. Since market cycles also include downturns, McCallie's portfolio is diversified to provide downside protection.

Our 2000 net endowment per student was \$39,283 as compared to our 2021 net endowment per student of \$146,132.

THE HONOR FUND



Many alumni, parents, and friends of the school give every year to The Honor Fund to support McCallie and provide endorsement for our mission. The Honor Fund helps narrow the financial gap between what it costs to provide the educational program and opportunities at McCallie and the amount of tuition that families pay. The compounded effect of this additional support and attention over time marks the difference between a good school and a great school.

McCALLIE STICKS WITH YOU FOR LIFE

I appreciate my McCallie story now more than when I was going through it. I guess that is the wisdom and perspective that comes with age.

I have been around McCallie my whole life. The Provine family moved to Chattanooga, on Oak Street, about a mile from campus, roughly about the same time that McCallie was founded in 1905.

I can remember being little, in a relatively segregated Chattanooga, driving through the tunnel looking over at McCallie. When I finally got to McCallie in 1982 as a new 7th-grader, I was excited because I always knew I was going to get to that campus. There were some incidents early on that made me realize that I was in the minority from a racial standpoint. What I couldn't appreciate at the time was the fact that I was one of the first 15 to 20 African American students to attend McCallie. But, overall, McCallie was a magical time for me and a supportive community.

Only later in my life have I fully understood the sacrifices that my parents made for my brother and me to go to McCallie, and my sister to GPS. Particularly, my mom. I can never fully show enough gratitude for their commitment to education for us and for how they stretched and sacrificed. Now, my wife and I are the parents. Like my parents before us, we are walking down that same path with our three kids. We are carrying forward that determination and critical belief in education that my mom started long ago. It's an investment we are happy to make. To instill the desire for lifelong learning, intellectual curiosity, the ability to debate competing ideas, the courage to do the right thing, to lead – all the things that were fostered in me as I spent

my formative years at McCallie – is a gift that my wife and I are paying forward, like my parents did. I give my mom the most credit. She actually served on the McCallie Board as the Parent Council representative, setting an example for my becoming a board member. My mom is a tremendous role model. She and my dad have been giving to The Honor Fund for 38 years in a row – real believers and supporters of McCallie.

I am currently in my third term (not consecutive terms) on the McCallie Board of Trustees. The McCallie Board is quite unique. We are a board of alums. You would expect this to be very insular, maybe a little self-serving, but, in actuality, people on the board roll up their sleeves, check their egos at the door, and really come in to support the Head of School, the administration, the faculty, and, most importantly, the boys. We talk about the boys all the time. It is all about the boys. Of course, the boys of yesterday are the alumni now, but, really, our work is about the boys who are at McCallie today, and also the boys who will one day step onto the campus as new students.

All of us on the Board bleed McCallie blue, but we don't let that blind us. We challenge ourselves with questions about considering outside perspectives, about being diverse

enough in our composition to inject fresh thought and ideas. We are willing to engage in hard discussion, to debate, and to take steps to lead. As with any institution, there are challenges and opportunities to be better. This is partly why I'm still engaged with McCallie to this day.

I am excited about the work that McCallie is doing to gather and connect the school's 350 African American alumni. As we get to know each other across the decades, it is amazing how we share a common experience, both at McCallie and as African American men in life. It is like discovering lots of long-lost brothers. We are just scratching the surface of this network of what we can do for each other and what we can do on behalf of the institution and for future McCallie boys. For example, like mentoring students today and their families as they join the McCallie community. I can't imagine how great it would have been when I was a student to have people to give my family and me the benefit of their McCallie experiences.

Coming back to campus, seeing some of the same teachers, working their whole careers at McCallie, gave me a whole new appreciation for their commitment to the school. I was inspired by these men and women back as a teenager, but I did not quite appreciate the magic of what they were doing and did not appreciate how important they were until much later. I often wonder if they know how much of an impact they had on our lives. All those conversations we had, during which they inevitably said something that sticks with you for the next thirty years. There is a natural affinity for the people and a place you feel really helped you become who you are.

When I left McCallie and got to Yale my first year, it was really a breeze in a lot of ways. I mean the biggest thing was being away from home and having to wash my own clothes. Other than that, I was very prepared academically. The comfort that I had in my own skin at McCallie was the best preparation for my life experiences that were yet to come. Learning to foster deep relationships was essential in both my personal and professional life beyond McCallie. The intellectual energy and atmosphere and the high expectations do not leave you once you leave McCallie. They create a drive for excellence that fuels the rest of your life.

As I look back, I realize very deeply that McCallie sticks with you. McCallie alumni have a real tangible love for each other, based on our past experiences. My McCallie relationships are lifelong relationships of 35 or 40 years at this point.. Even if we don't see each other much for a period of time, it is amazing how we fall right back into place with

ease. I think about myself as the young boy who showed up in 1982, how proud I felt to be part of the McCallie community. Only later did I realize that the McCallie family is a lot bigger than I ever imagined as a seventh-grader.

My message to fellow alumni is this:

Be engaged. Recognize the impact McCallie has had on your life. McCallie is only as good as its alumni engagement.

Find out what is happening on campus. Have interest in the young men who will be the leaders of tomorrow.

Rest assured McCallie is in good hands leadership-wise and is still impacting boys' lives. The things that made it strong then are still in place but we are taking our strengths to new heights as well. Lee Burns was a kind and engaged fellow student just a year ahead of me on my same Chapel row. He now leads the school he loves with that same character and intention he exhibited many years ago now focused on making McCallie the best it can be.

Help us cast a wide net to find diverse boys and families to become part of McCallie. When students today graduate from McCallie, they will be immersed in many different places and communities that are no doubt more diverse than McCallie is now. The last thing we want for our boys is to leave the Ridge and be ill-prepared to work, play, or serve on a team with individuals that reflect the rich diversity of the world at large. Help us be that more inclusive and diverse place of choice for those great, deserving boys regardless of their ethnicity, socio-economic status or home address.



Foster the relationships that you built at McCallie. Write a note to the teachers that impacted your life to let them know the difference they made. Reach out to classmates you haven't talked to in a while, find out about their lives. You still have a lot in common based on your shared experiences at McCallie. McCallie is a lifelong family.

I have a reminiscing sensibility. In a strange way, when I was at McCallie I had an inkling that I would be connected to McCallie for life. I remember back when I was the co-editor of the yearbook, writing the ending letter. I could not fathom that my McCallie experience would be ending then and there. My continued connection to McCallie has exceeded every expectation. I am grateful for what McCallie has been for me, and continues to be. And, I am happy to be a small part of keeping McCallie strong and relevant for the boys of yesterday, today and tomorrow. For McCallie, tell me when to show up and I'll be there. I know I am not alone in this appreciation of and commitment to my beloved alma mater. On McCallie.

LEADING THE WAY



The new GPS-McCallie Rowing Center is being used with enthusiasm. Both schools cancelled their rowing seasons last year due to the pandemic. By contrast this year, since the start of school both teams have been on the water in preparation for their competitions.

The GPS-McCallie Rowing Center contains separate locker rooms for both schools' programs, office space for coaches, storage for both schools' rowing shells, ergonomic machines and other equipment, restrooms for use by rowing spectators, and a new dock. A multipurpose room with a catering kitchen makes events in the space possible. The new center supports McCallie's already established and successful rowing program. McCallie is proud to lead the way in establishing rowing as a major school sport in the Southeast. This new facility certainly supports that goal and sets McCallie apart from other schools in our region.

McCallie has had a varsity rowing program since the early 1990s and has established a national reputation among college preparatory schools. Many of the program's graduates have received scholarships to row at top colleges and universities throughout the nation. Both GPS and McCallie continue to play an integral part in the Head of the Hooch Regatta, one of the largest rowing events in the U.S., which is held in downtown Chattanooga each fall.

The new rowing center would not have become a reality without two dedicated alumni leading the way. Elliott Davenport and Glenn Morris served as co-chairs of the Rowing Center Campaign. Neither Davenport nor Morris were rowers but that didn't deter their enthusiasm for this project one bit.

Elliott Davenport explains the need for a new rowing center.

McCallie found itself in the position of having a well-subscribed, highly successful crew program and sub-standard facilities to support that program. If our program had not developed to the level that it had, I don't think there would have been as much interest in investing in a new facility. The school quietly got into rowing with the encouragement of faculty member Doc Swanson, and Spencer McCallie III '55 bought one boat a number of years back. I don't even know where they kept it. They lugged it to the river every day, and lugged it back again. Over time, the program built up to about 80 rowers. One program – a non-TSSAA sanctioned sport – with that many boys participating alerted the Board of Trustees that there must be something to this. We wanted a facility that supports the type of program and the type of coach you need for an exceptional program. A high percentage of former rowers contributed to the project. They had a unique understanding of the benefits of the rowing program, seeing it as a factor in their success beyond McCallie.

Our previous boathouse facility on the river was simply inadequate, and inadequate is about the nicest word that I can give it. Now we have this new facility that meets all of McCallie's needs and GPS's needs. We worked with architects from Cambridge who were boathouse specialists. They knew where the racks needed to be

inside. They knew the radius you need to turn trailers around. They designed a wonderful tool and work room where the rowers can examine and repair the boats. It was a big undertaking and collaborative effort between our two schools that took years of work to pull all the pieces together. And in the end, it was worth it to have this great new shared facility.

Glenn Morris explains the strategic importance of the new rowing center.

It is a funny thing that although I briefly rowed while at Tennessee, and Elliott had never been in a boat, it was easy for us to see the value-add offered by this new facility. I firmly believe this state-of-the-art rowing center will be a transformative addition to both McCallie and GPS allowing them to continue to develop their rowing programs to their highest potential. Transformational moments in the life of the school are significant moments in the life of the donor as well. Spears Stadium is an example of a transformative moment supported by donors who thought it would be an important structure for the school, that it would be a place that regularly brought the community together. If you look at the people who came before us and supported McCallie, you realize that they were fully aware they were building fields they would never play on, or labs in which they would never study. Likewise, I supported a boathouse that I won't use. But you do it because you understand that McCallie doesn't happen for the next generation if it weren't for the previous generation's involvement and investment.

It just doesn't happen unless we, our generation, keep it going. And, each generation after that keeps it going. We must continue the transformative impact McCallie has on boys. I feel happily and joyously obligated to try and make sure that future generations of adolescent boys can come through school and become McCallie men for life. The world needs more McCallie men in place, whether it is Wall Street or down the street. Men who understand the value of a handshake and who are committed to kindness, humility, and a sense of values and character. McCallie graduates value and care for one another. We see each other without judgment, which gets translated into a sense of belonging in the community. I am thrilled to be a part of that.

Glenn Morris stays involved at McCallie for two reasons.

I am involved in McCallie for two reasons. First, McCallie is one of the few places that still teaches and models character – Honor, Truth, and Duty. They shaped me. As many adolescent boys who come to be men under the guidance and wisdom of McCallie, the better off the country and many parts of the world are. McCallie comes along in a boy's life when he needs not to be alone. He needs other boys he can see going through the same thing he is and who look out for one another. At McCallie we learn to take care of ourselves and our brothers.

Secondly, success cannot be measured in dollars and decimal points. I think it is measured in one's involvement in the world and how you are making the world a better place. We learned to do that at McCallie. The realization and appreciation of what I gained at McCallie leads me to stay involved. There is a familiarity and a comfort that I got from McCallie during my time in school that I want to continue. I think it is unusual to run into adults you went to high school with back then, and talk as if we just saw each other at lunch yesterday in the dining hall. The nicknames, the kidding, the stories. I think that is cool. And, amazingly it is still there. In short, a desire to give back as well as a deep interest in perpetuating McCallie and its transformative impact on many, many other boys keeps me involved.

Elliott Davenport believes it important to give back and give forward.

I give for the faculty who have given and devoted so much of their time and attention to students. They give their whole professional careers for the development of boys at

McCallie. These dedicated men and women make sure that we are better situated and better able to go out into the world and handle things. They sacrificed for me, invested in me. What I can do now is the same in return for them. It's that simple for me. I give because I want to give back what I have gotten. I will never be able to give back all that I have gotten, but I can try.

McCallie is about making boys better, making them into men who will change their piece of the world, wherever that is. Now, as an adult, knowing that I am giving to boys who will become world-changers is exciting to me. McCallie is a great incubator of talent in the form of future national and world leaders.

I give back with a sense of duty and gratitude. I give forward because I want future generations of boys to have what I was fortunate enough to have at McCallie.

FIRST PAYCHECK BECOMES A FIRST-FRUITS OFFERING

I started McCallie as a freshman boarding student from Georgia. One of the gifts of being a boarder was to be surrounded by classmates who were trying to grow from a boy to a man and a gentleman, like I was. Living together in the dorm with all these great guys, we grew up together and held each other accountable. It's the idea that the rising tide lifts all boats.

Living in a dorm starting at age 15 taught me important things like how to keep my room clean, how not to smell terrible, and other things that come with being a teenager. I cannot stress the importance of who you spend time with and who you choose to do life with. I firmly believe that you become like the people who you spend the most time with. The relationships that I made as a boarder are relationships that I will carry with me through the rest of my life. Without a doubt, I consider my McCallie friends to be my brothers.

Going away to boarding school was a challenge for my mother at first. She soon realized that, while we were separated in a way, it gave us more appreciation for the time we did have, like the holidays or during the summers. We learned to savor the moments that we had together. We easily fell into a rhythm where I would call home to catch up. My mom did not have to be the one to tell me to clean up my room and do my homework because I was learning to manage those things for myself at school. I believe our relationship was stronger and better for it.

The Michaels-Dickson Scholarship made McCallie feasible for my family. Because of Michaels-Dickson, attending McCallie became not just something that I wanted to do but something I could do. My peer Michaels-Dickson Scholars were quality guys who were also an immediate group of

close friends who you would want by your side as you do high school. They were equally motivated about their school work and passionate about interests they had outside of the classroom. We were all looking for a little bit more than what we had in our hometowns.

McCallie would not be McCallie if it didn't have the Michaels-Dickson Scholars program. But more importantly, if it didn't have a large group of men and women who are so devoted to the development of young guys into scholars, athletes, and men of character. They are vested in seeing us become men and gentlemen who live by the code of McCallie Honor, Truth, and Duty and glorifying God and enjoying Him forever. After McCallie I realized that I had so many mentors at McCallie who cared about me as a person. Unlike mentors in college or work that care about your performance, the men and women at McCallie cared about what and how I was doing, who I was and who I was becoming. Life lessons and values are clearly communicated and modeled from the faculty.

My academic experience at McCallie was inspiring. In college there were so many courses and classes in big lecture halls with hundreds of students. At McCallie I always felt like the teachers and my peer group were there as encouragers and supporters, pushing me to be a better student, a better

Coxswain's Lessons for Life

Rowing was a big part of my time and experience at McCallie, and it happened quite serendipitously. Coach Merrion made a chapel announcement asking kids to come sign up for the rowing team. Because I was a pretty small kid, I remember that he mentioned that you don't have to be this big athletic guy to join. Coach Merrion said the team needed little guys who might want to be a coxswain. So, I showed up one day, became a coxswain, and did that for four years.

Rowing was something that I really enjoyed. It was also a way for me to get to know other guys and develop a set friend group. My friend group ended up being mostly other boarding students and rowers. We were a tight-knit group of guys and really stuck with each other throughout our time at McCallie, and even to this day.

A good coxswain is a skilled communicator who pays attention to the right things at the right time, who can also listen carefully and processes quickly. Coxswains have to communicate an idea to their rowers or the coach in a succinct and authoritative manner. You have to learn what to focus on and when. This requires dividing your attention between different things at once, like steering the boat, watching the rowers and making sure they are in time with one another, and monitoring your competitors' position. Then, you have to zero in on what is most important right now to achieve the best outcome for your boat. Some people call the coxswain the jockey of a rowing shell. All of these things translate well to any sort of team in adult life.

Rowers work hard and have a great appreciation for the craft of the sport. It can be a beautiful thing when you've got eight guys in the shell rowing perfectly in sync with one another resulting in a really fast boat moving well through the water. It takes a level of self-sacrifice to be a successful team member. The individual rower has to be malleable to the shell and to his teammates. The rower's ego satisfaction comes from being as team-oriented or selfless as possible so that the team can be as in sync as possible. These are good lessons for life that I attribute to my time at McCallie as a coxswain.

coxswain, better at anything that I did. At McCallie my classroom experience was defined by participation and the relationship I had with my teachers. Teachers pushed us to figure things out on our own but were there for guidance. At college I missed the atmosphere of one-to-one attention from the teacher and rousing discussions between students that led us all to better understanding, both of each other and the ideas we were exploring. I don't think Yale would have been available to me without McCallie because I would not have had the academics, extracurriculars and especially, the college counseling support.

I committed to giving my first paycheck back to McCallie because it was the right thing to do. I reflected on my time at McCallie and realized that I wouldn't be where I am without McCallie and all of the people who have helped me along the way. I knew that I would soon be receiving my first paycheck from my first summer working in New York. I decided it was a good opportunity for me to take this money and give back to McCallie. My alternative was to let the money sit in my savings account, then eventually give it away when I am older. Instead I wanted to give it away immediately as a “first-fruits offering” to let it grow and get to work now. I wanted to make an investment in McCallie now so that forty years from now, my small gift will be a lot bigger. McCallie is definitely an institution that I feel good about giving money to today because I know that they will use the money in the best way possible.



I think people my age think that smaller gifts just aren't going to have an impact, but I think they can over time. A smaller gift today is going to go just as far as that larger gift I could make when I am 65 years-old. My small gift will bear fruit in the future for students at McCallie – just like other donors in the past invested in McCallie so that I was able to afford it in my day. So, in my end analysis, the return that money was going to earn in my savings account was not nearly as great as the impact that it would have at McCallie, nor as great as the gratitude it gave me.

I have recently realized that the value of McCallie is growing as I become an older adult. Telling the truth, living with integrity, following a code of honor are the values

that I build my life around. My close McCallie friends also live by the same creed. One part that feels more relevant after McCallie is duty. Having been through McCallie and benefitted from all of the experiences and influences I had there, I am asking myself: what is expected of me now? I am interested in both paying back and paying forward the gifts I have received as much as possible. The beauty of developing this foundation for life at McCallie is that I know who I am and what I believe in. This serves as a strong rudder to guide me in the places that I will live and experiences I will have in my life beyond McCallie.



When I went to college, I was so prepared and grounded. At Furman, there were many other boys from McCallie and our connection was instant. That was my first inkling that the brotherhood and McCallie community extended beyond my graduating class. I began to understand that there is a shared experience that transcends time and connects McCallie alumni throughout the decades.

I have never really had much separation from McCallie. When I came back from college, I still had two younger brothers (Jeff '91 and Greg '95) at McCallie. I always came to watch them play football.

If I hadn't come to McCallie, I believe I would have turned out fine. That McCallie makes you successful is not true. It is not the school but the people in the school – both the faculty and your peers – who help you become the man you are meant to be and make it easier to succeed.

I gave my first gift to McCallie in 1993, the year after I graduated from college. It was \$50. I did it because it was the right thing to do.

As I think about my giving over the years, a few insights come to mind. It is not as hard to give now. That first \$50.00 represented a large percentage of my





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income and net worth at the time. Giving also keeps me connected and informed. In addition to monetary contributions I have given of my time. I am particularly enjoying my involvement with the McCallie Athletic Council.

People ask me why I give to McCallie when I have two daughters. It is a fair question. My daughters are at GPS. I figure the boys they are around will most likely be McCallie boys so I have a vested interest in knowing if McCallie is still producing good upstanding young gentlemen. I am happy to say that the McCallie boys I have met through my daughters are well-behaved and respectful.

Giving to McCallie is a well-established habit for me. The school has proven to be a good steward of its financial resources and continues to create an atmosphere that inspires boys, yields stellar athletic performance, sends boys to good colleges, and stays interested in its alumni. I have given to McCallie for 28 years, which qualifies me for the Campbell Society. I hope 28 years from now that I am active, healthy, still involved, and have a grandson or two who are thriving at McCallie. For me, it's McCallie for life.

History of the Campbell Society

In 1946, Gaines Campbell Sr. formed the the Patrons' Sustaining Fund, which has been renamed The Honor Fund. Since its inception, this fund has enabled McCallie to recruit, retain, and develop world-class teachers and to provide financial assistance to students and their families.

Gaines Campbell Jr. '45 and Gaines Campbell III '73 have continued the legacy of philanthropy that was modeled for them by Gaines Campbell Sr. by consistently contributing to The Honor Fund. In honor of the loyalty of those, like the Campbell family, who help sustain McCallie's excellence through annual gifts, the school in 2020–21 established the Campbell Society to recognize individuals who have given to McCallie for twenty-five or more years. A group of over 1250 households comprise the inaugural membership of the Campbell Society. They faithfully honor the school through their financial contributions. Their philanthropic leadership and generosity enable the school to continually do the work of creating excellence and transforming the lives of its students.

NANCY AND DAVID STONECIPHER '59

BUILDING A PHILANTHROPIC LEGACY

David Stonecipher and his wife Nancy have played a key role in organizing and sharing the importance of investing in McCallie's future. Since graduating in 1959, David has been involved in McCallie in many ways, including three terms on the board of trustees, and was Board Chair from 2008–10. Inspiring others to participate in legacy giving through the Founders Club has reinvigorated the school's spirit of generosity, duty, and philanthropy.

The founding McCallie family financially supported the school during its early successful years. The founding Trustees pledged support as they assumed leadership of the school in 1937. In accordance with this history of strong financial support, McCallie seeks a new generation of "founders" to ensure the school's continued strength and success for its next 100 years. Several years ago, this need led to the creation of the Founders Club, a group of alumni and parents who love the school and want to ensure an outstanding McCallie experience for young men of future generations. The Founders Club is proving to be a successful vehicle and a supportive community committed to significantly growing McCallie's endowment through legacy giving.

Founders Club members commit to a significant multi-year legacy gift. Unique provisions of gifts to the Founders Club include reinvesting rather than spending any returns during the first five years. This reinvesting provision

enables these gifts to grow far more significantly over the long term. "One of the six imperatives of the Board's strategic plan is to ensure that McCallie is positioned on the strongest financial foundation possible," said David Stonecipher '59, Chairman of the Founders Club and former Board Chair. "To do so will give future generations of McCallie boys the same life-changing experience that you, I, and thousands of others have had." Mr. Stonecipher's initial legacy gift established the Founders Club.

David Stonecipher firmly believes that a strong endowment is the key component in McCallie's future success. The endowment directly supports the people of the school by providing salary and professional development for faculty as well as merit- and need-based financial aid for students. In addition, the endowment provides permanent assets to support projects that complement and enhance the school's mission.





The essential element of an endowment gift that sets it apart from a one-time gift is that it is permanent. It is a legacy gift. An endowment gift is saved and invested for accumulation, not spent or allocated to annual operations. The endowment investment income provides a stream of income for the school each year. The amount of annual endowment draw is determined by the Board of Trustees and is typically 3% to 5% of the investment income. McCallie's endowment serves many important goals. It grows from year to year based on market value, links individuals and families with the school in a meaningful way, forces donors and school officials to think long-term about the needs of the school, and holds trustees accountable for long-term financial management.

While the Founders Club started as an informal group of donors, it has turned into a formal part of McCallie's advancement efforts, working in tandem with the Board of Trustees to help grow the endowment in order to sustain the school for years to come. Founders Club members make a pledge of at least \$1,000,000 with prepayment on that pledge of at least \$200,000 within five to eight years. Founders Club members are invited to attend an annual retreat during which members and their spouses are introduced to one another. They also participate in a series of discussions with Board members and administrators about the direction and vision of the school. Current Founders Club members range in age from 40-something to 70+. Over just a few years, the group has grown to 27 families who have collectively committed over \$82 million to McCallie. They are committed to having at least one member from every class of alumni.

The Founders Club's significant capital influx to the endowment helps position McCallie on strong financial footing for the future. "Founders Club members recognize that McCallie is undercapitalized compared with other great schools, and we are working to build McCallie's endowment through our gifts," Mr. Stonecipher said. "Our endowment is a key component in our ability to attract excellent faculty, achieve our strategic plan goals, and continue to serve boys as we have for generations. In addition, a larger endowment allows our Board of Trustees to plan with even greater confidence."

CONTINUING A LEGACY OF GIVING

Barbara and Richard Hall gave to McCallie for over 28 years. Upon the death of their mother in 2019, the Hall family established the Barbara Hall Scholarship Fund which provides student financial aid.

At McCallie, Chris and Ben Hall were both four-year boarding students. Both had positive, powerful experiences. Their parents' philanthropy and generosity toward the school have influenced both Chris and Ben's commitment to continuing the legacy of giving that their parents modeled. They plan to continue support for the Barbara Hall Scholarship Fund. The sense of purpose, meaning, and generosity that motivate the Hall family continue to make McCallie a possibility for boys in the future.

How did you find your way to McCallie?

Chris Hall: As I was approaching high school, it became apparent to both me and my parents that I would benefit from a different environment. At the time we were living in Sewanee, Tennessee and about to move to Atlanta. I needed a bigger community, a place where I could express myself differently. I also needed more structure and discipline. I ran into a friend of my parents' who was an alum and he encouraged me to consider McCallie. My plan had been to go up north but McCallie had the advantage of being closer and more convenient to family. I went to visit McCallie for a day and fell in love with it. I ended up having such a good experience at McCallie that my parents began looking for boarding schools for my younger sister, Gretchen, and my brother, Ben. I have

really come to understand what a selfless act of love it is to send a child to boarding school when it is clear he needs something other than what is available at home. McCallie is such an amazing place and I learned so much. It is hard to imagine my life without McCallie.

Ben Hall: Education had primacy in our family above everything else. To get a good education was at the forefront of our parents' thinking and our values, and in turn, ours'. Our grandfather used to say education was the one thing that cannot be taken away from you. The importance of education drives our continued relationships with our educational institutions to this day. When I came to McCallie, I was following Chris but I also liked McCallie a lot. I visited Chris, stayed in the dorm, ran track practice, and got to know a few people. It turns out that I am still friends with some of those guys today. I had a really great visit which is a testament to the breadth of McCallie because my needs were different from Chris's. And, it helped that our parents were adamant that each of us go to the place that was the best fit for us. It is important to note when thinking about how I got to McCallie that my parents were not doing well financially at the time. I was fortunate to receive the McIlwaine '58 Scholarship which made all the difference to my situation.

Was it important to you to attend an all-boys school?

Ben: Friendships between boys happen more easily at an all-boys school. I used to do a week of Cross Country camp before school started. There would be about thirty guys training. Day and boarding students staying together in the dorm. This was a particularly fun time because we got to know each other without the pressure of school because it had not started yet. Those relationships are what I remember the most. The fun that we had and the bonds we developed were incredible. Many of those relationships are still strong in my life today. In the end, it has been less the classroom experiences and more the outside people experiences that have stuck with me over the years.

Chris: I was not necessarily set on an all-boys school. Our mom went to a single-sex college and neither of our parents went to boarding school. So, I don't think it had to be a boy's school but I am glad that it was. It is simply not true that at an all-boys school you don't see girls. We had girls from all of the local schools around. Looking back, as a teenage boy, it was a good thing to not have girls in classes. There was no need to focus on impressing girls instead of listening and learning. At McCallie, it was okay to be smart and to fully engage in class. Our teachers encouraged us to think out loud, to ask questions, and to test ideas as an important part of the educational process.

Alumni often remember McCallie faculty not as teachers, but as transformative mentors and guides. Was this your experience?

Chris: We were fortunate that in our era at McCallie, we had a lot of teachers who were winding up 40 and 50 year careers, and a lot of teachers who were starting 40 and 50 year careers. We had legendary teachers who helped form who you are. They met you where you were and helped you grow from there. They were legendary to us and made the process of growing up all the better. The joy of teaching that they had and the love of boys was really incredible. I came freshman year as a boarder and my first few months were brutal. I tested really well and was placed into classes for which I was completely unprepared. This experience really taught me to fail. The fact that I didn't get yanked out of there has been one of the best lessons for me. My teachers, parents, and I worked through it; it was not easy. Everyone is going to fail at some point so learning how to handle it is essential. How you respond to failures will make you who you are. I feel McCallie helped me learn this by letting me go through a hard situation.

Ben: The teacher relationship at McCallie is much more of a mentoring relationship. I have never had that type of supportive, guiding teacher again. One example of this was going to Compline on Wednesday nights. This was an Episcopal prayer service. This was an opportunity to get to know students outside of the classroom. It proved to be a grounding and bonding experience for me. I remember Bill Jamieson gave me a *Book of Common Prayer* when I

graduated and I still use it. It's a small example and there were many relationships like this. I can remember a time period when I was really pushing hard, making myself physically sick doing so. My advisor, Miles McNiff, worked with my parents to get their pressure and ambition for me back to a healthy place. Seeing the importance of mental health and learning how to manage it has been life-defining for me.

Chris: My bonds from McCallie are a foundation that I will always have. McCallie means a lot to me. At McCallie you meet people and develop the relationships you are going to have the rest of your life. When you go away at 14 or 15 years old, you bond quickly and you make your way together. It's lots of fun times, probing boundaries and independence. It is a journey of becoming an adult that you go on with guys who are your good lifelong friends.

Dorm life was so much fun. Shared common experiences at a very formative time of your life. Midnight in the dorm – nothing like it. You can't make up stories like we lived through. Those are the amazing experiences that bond you.

Why have you chosen to stay involved and to support McCallie financially?

Chris: A sense of service and philanthropy started in our family home. Both were a family value. Mom and Dad promoted McCallie wherever they were. They believed in the school and the mission. They saw what the impact McCallie had on their kids and were interested in passing along that same benefit to others. In addition to financial contributions, our mom was very generous with her time and knowledge. She did the College Kickoff Seminar every year since she was one of the top college admissions' brains in the country for a long time. She often spoke at McCallie events sharing our family's experience with the school. She loved McCallie and loved meeting the people of McCallie. Our parents were proud to give back to McCallie. It was important to them until the day they died. I wish I could give McCallie a lot more money but that's not my reality right now. What I can do is come up for Tornado Term to share my expertise, or cook for the soccer team when they are in Atlanta. I can also encourage boys to go to school there. McCallie is such a meaningful place to me. I stay in touch with my McCallie friends and keep up with McCallie happenings. It is hard to explain how the bonds that I created at McCallie have anchored me in my life.

If I can help other boys have that same experience, I am committed to doing that.

Ben: McCallie is an incredibly unique place that is worthy of my time and support. I am very proud of McCallie and what it continues to do. It is exciting to see how the school is changing as it also stays the same. Keeping the best of McCallie is important and moving forward to keep the school relevant is important. As we have become adults, we understand so much more about our parents' commitment to education and to McCallie. As kids, you are just now aware. Now, we have a tremendous respect for the sacrifices my parents made and the decisions they made that allowed us to experience McCallie. Mom and Dad worked in higher education so they understood the importance of what giving to a school meant. Our family didn't have a lot of excess resources. We were afforded an opportunity to go to McCallie through financial aid. As things improved for my parents financially, they got into a position where they could give. It was very important to them to give back and they impressed that upon us. Going to school at McCallie is a major commitment. I certainly would not have been able to attend McCallie without the McIlwain Scholarship. If I can help any student go to McCallie like others did for me, I am all in.
