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How will Saint Joe Communicate with Families?



SCHOOL WEBSITE: At **saintjoehigh.com** the school posts the calendar of events, school news, athletics information, online uniform ordering, and the cafeteria menu. There are also links to the handbook, faculty/staff directory, and PowerSchool.

SOUNDINGS E-NEWSLETTER: Distributed every other week, this e-newsletter features campus happenings and is the primary vehicle for school-to-parent communication.

LETTERS FROM THE PRINCIPAL/ADMINISTRATION: The Principal or an administrator may share announcements, updates, or other focused communications via email, in addition to Soundings. These communications are as needed.

COUNSELING E-NEWSLETTER: On a monthly basis, parents receive updates related to social and emotional wellbeing, course placement and registration, college and career preparedness. Counseling newsletters are also linked in Soundings.

FOCUS MAGAZINE: Published twice a year, Focus highlights current students and alumni, and features more in-depth articles about campus and the Saint Joe community. Parents, former parents, alumni and friends receive this magazine.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS

In the event of a school delay or closure, Saint Joseph High School will send an e-mail blast to parents. The announcement will also be posted to **www.saintjoehigh.com** and sent via push notification through the Saint Joseph High School app. Delays or closings will also appear on local media stations.

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Definitions, Traditions, and Lingo

Lingo Definitions



Shofar Sho-far/SHōfər/

Noun: a ram's-horn trumpet used by ancient Jews in religious ceremonies and as a battle signal, now sounded at Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

At Saint Joe, students are called to attend monthly All-School Mass with the sounding of the shofar. This tradition started in the old building when Fr. Bly called the community to Mass. Fr. Bly last sounded the shofar in 2012, on the final day of classes in the old building.



Shookie Shookie/SHooke/

Noun: Unique to Saint Joe, the shookie is a delectable treat comprised of fresh-baked chocolate chip cookies held together by soft serve ice cream. School legend has it that the Shookie originated sometime in the early 1980s.



Holy War / hole wô(ə)r/

Noun: a war declared or waged in support of a religious cause. Or, in our case, anytime Saint Joe competes against our cross-town rival, Marian.

Fun fact: For over 20 years, the student section has chosen to wear black to the Holy War, continuing the theme "Black out the Knights" from year to year.



Dress Down Day (DDD) Dress Down Day / 'dres doun dey/

Noun: A school day fundraiser, usually a Friday, whereby students and faculty dress less formally than usual in exchange for a donation to a predetermined charitable organization.

FISTBUMPS!

On the first day of each semester, the entire community is so fired up to welcome students that we greet one another with fistbumps all day long. Students, teachers, and staff keep track of the number of fistbumps shared, and we celebrate the tally at day's end. On the first day of school last year, the community shared an astounding 94,730 fistbumps! While we might not be able to share fistbumps this August, we know the tradition will continue!





Community Traditions

Community service is central to the Saint Joseph High School experience, and we take great pride in our annual efforts to make the world a better place. Yes, community service hours are required of individual students, but these annual events allow us to build community together.

Diaper Drive - You heard that right! The whole school brings in baby diapers for the Women's Care Center across the street. Organized by Saint Joe's Right to Life Club, the Diaper Drive produces so many donations that the entire school builds a human chain extending through the upper hallway, down Notre Dame Avenue, and across the street to the Women's Care Center, passing diaper packages hand-overhand until they arrive at their destination. #WeLoveBabies

The Hunger Bowl happens in conjunction with the Saint Joe vs Marian football game (cue the Holy War!). It's an all-out competition to see which Catholic school can contribute more food to Saint Vincent de Paul ... a little sibling rivalry that benefits a worthy cause.

Dating back to the 1980s, and led by Saint Joe's h.o.p.e. Club since 1990, the **Thanksgiving Food Drive** organizes hundreds of Thanksgiving meals — including turkey, stuffing, and all the trimmings — each year. The entire Black

Box Theatre is overtaken by an assembly line, as volunteers pack enormous boxes full to bursting with holiday fare.

At the conclusion of our monthly All-School Mass in Alumni Gym, Saint Joe honors three **Community Award winners** — one male and one female student, and one faculty/staff member. Honorees are nominated by students and selected for exemplary service to Saint Joe. Half the fun is noticing when the student body has guessed that month's recipient — usually marked by quiet rumblings developing into full-volume cheers as the recipient's name is mentioned.

School Spirit is alive and well, as evidenced by strong student participation in football and basketball games. Each week students dress according to a predetermined theme (Hawaiian, USA, etc). During halftime, the seniors choose a student to read a prayer or a poem.

These are just a few of the many special traditions that make Saint Joe a unique and vibrant place. We could write pages on the traditions reserved just for seniors! Tiedyed uniform polo shirts, handprints in the tunnel, the euchre tournament, the senior breakfast ... These and others will be revealed throughout your time at Saint Joe.
