Lidia—the recipient of a Sokoloff grant, which funds a student's Independent Service Project—reached out to local nonprofits to learn how she and other students could contribute in a positive way. She partnered with an organization that provides temporary shelter and resources for families experiencing homelessness. Lidia got to know some families and used her grant to purchase children's games and toys to bring to these locations.

“I really wanted to make it a sustainable project that could be used by future SPS students. Most of the people we were working with were at one point living in houses and were stable. They don't necessarily want a ton of help; they just would like resources in order to keep moving.”
